
## **LESSON 20**

## **REVIEW OF LESSON 17-19**

- 1. A tie is a curved line that connects two notes of the *same* pitch
- 2. The tone is sustained as if the two notes were *one* note.
- 3. A slur is a curved line connecting two notes of *different* pitch.
- 4. A slur indicates that the music is to be sung or played as *smooth* as possible, giving the impression of a continuous line.
- 5. Two dots placed before a double bar are called a *repeat* sign.
- 6. A repeat sign means you go back to the *beginning* of the piece and play it again.
- 7. Sometimes, you repeat from another *repeat* sign.
- 8. If a piece has a first and second ending, you play the first ending the *first* time only. On the repeat you *skip* the first ending and play the *second* ending.
- 9. Add the number of counts and write the sums.



10. Subtract the number of beats and write the rest.



11. Write the word tie or slur, describing the curved line in each bar/measure.



12. Every bar/measure has one error. Make the necessary changes or additions to correct each measure.
